The devastating April 25 earthquake has claimed the lives of over 6,000. As the toll is rising and new updates of damage emerging, there have been increasing complaints of lack of effective efforts for the distribution of relief to the victims and their rehabilitation. The physical properties have been damaged in dozens of districts including the districts of the Kathmandu Valley. People are grieving. It is necessary for all of us to vow to create a new Nepal by turning this grief to power.

The leaders, who were giving eloquent speeches of the progress of people and the country, are not on the ground consoling the traumatized people. We urge all the political parties and their sister organizations to show their presence in their constituencies and take a charge in providing relief and management for the quake victims. All should be thinking for country in this difficult hour rather than creating panic among the people or spreading rumors.

INSEC is ready to work with government, political parties and other stakeholders to mitigate the people's pain. INSEC has mobilized its staffs at the central office, regional offices and district offices and its district representatives in all 75 districts in the work of distribution of relief and rehabilitation and is updating the new information on its website.
